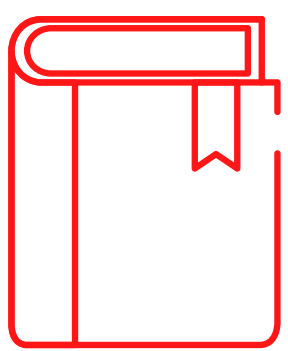


Rules for Taking an Avant Test

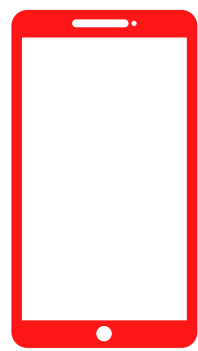
